## FROM THE PROPERTY COMMITTEE

A number of church groups have complained about the condition of the hall floor. The surface seal has worn away and has become impossible to clean properly. We have enquired about having the floor re-sealed and polished and it appears that this would involve 100 hours of work and cost £300 in materials. However, we have received advice from a school caretaker instructing us on how to do the job ourselves. The job will not require any great skill or be particularly heavy work - most of it involves pushing mops.

If we could do the task ourselves we could save £1000 or more. The question that needs to be asked is: do we have the person power? Four or five people working together could complete the task in two or three days. It has been suggested that the best time to do it would be the end of July and the first two weeks in August - this would involve the least disruption to regular activities. At this stage I am only reviewing the feasibility of doing the job ourselves. If you think you can offer some help please indicate on the sheet on the notice board.
