## **Talents Questionnaire**

Are you giving your talents in the service of the Kingdom of God? The church council believes that a lot of gifts that we have in our church community are not being used. During the past year we have been preparing a church community talents questionnaire. On the first Sunday in Lent (13 February) we are going to launch the questionnaire and hope that everyone in the church community will take the time to pray about it and to see what they feel they could offer to serve Christ in the church and in the world. In the first instance, positive responses on the returned questionnaires will be referred to James and me. It's a time when it will be important to encourage one another and to build up the body of Christ.

## **Outreach events**

I was delighted with the success of the Burns' Night. We filled the suite that we hired at the Borington Hall hotel. We had bagpipes, haggis and an excellent meal, many of the traditional items and a very fitting address from David Meredith. It was good of David to come from Smithton, near Inverness, and it gave him an opportunity to experience an evangelical Methodist Church. We had a significant number of 'guests' from outside of the church community at this event and that is a very encouraging sign. James Darby is working away at planning more outreach events and I hope we can continue to give him our support.

## **Thursday Bible study and ICES**

I changed my mind at the last minute and have decided to do a ten session Bible study on the 'Bird's Eye View of the Old Testament' on Thursday evenings (7.30 pm, fortnightly as advertised). By the time you read this we shall have mastered Genesis in eight words (creation, fall, flood, tower, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph). With Genesis behind us we have eight further studies to which all are welcome.

We have nearly finished the first ICES (Interactive Christian Extension Studies) on the Synoptic Gospels and Acts. If there is sufficient interest, I hope to start another 10 session ICES course on the Letters of Paul in March. Because I lead the course I am a bit biased but I have asked Lynne and Catherine to tell you about it:

*Lynne Rogers writes: I have nearly completed the first ICES course on the Synoptic Gospels and Acts. We work through our Bible study folders at home and we meet about every 10 days. The group meetings have been good. I have learned a lot, enjoyed the company of others doing ICES and had the benefit of the help of the group leader (John Haley). Some of us have had a go at the written assignments and this has been both challenging and satisfying - to know that with some guidance and encouragement I could do it. I know that the way to gain a deeper understanding of God's plan for us is by studying the Bible, something which before beginning ICES I did not really know how to do and it's this that is the most important part for me.*

Catherine Stead writes: *Bible study is not about learning facts (though they might come in useful!) but about deepening your faith through greater understanding of the Bible. The ICES course is rewarding not just because it increases your knowledge about the Bible (though it does), but also because it asks you to consider what you think and believe - and why. The ICES course on the Synoptic Gospels and Acts has helped me to understand more about the gospel accounts of the life and teaching of Jesus, and about my own response to them. The course is accessible and the discussions interesting. Nobody should be put off by thinking it is too hard for them, because it's not! If you have done Christianity Explored, Alpha or a similar course and want to learn more, or if you just want to know more about the Bible, then the ICES course can help you.*

If you would like to see an ICES workbook or know more about the course, please ask me. I would be encouraged to hear from you.

### **Notice from Church Property and Management Committee**

Our Church Building has been open for 11 years and some parts of it have not been re-decorated at all. The property stewards aim to redecorate all the top floor of the building this year. We plan to start in the lounge, working through to the hall and kitchen. The painting of the church itself may have to be contracted out due to the height.

In order for this to happen we need several teams to take on parts of the task. For example - cleaning and preparation of the lounge to be done by one team, followed by a painting team. In order to help us accomplish this major task we are planning to be flexible with the timing of the work. E.g. The cleaning / preparation tasks have been broken down so that at a time of their choosing (assuming the area is not in use) someone could spend say 45 mins on a task, the task then being signed off on the task sheet. (Please see task sheets on the notice board) With a little effort from a lot of people the job will soon be done. We can't expect it all to be done by John Duerden and his small band of helpers especially as John's health isn't what it was.

If you can help with cleaning and preparation please contact Pat Stead or put your name on the sheet fixed to the entrance notice board.

If you can help with painting please contact John Buttle or add your name to the appropriate notice. Everyone will probably be affected by the scheme. Apart from the need for helpers there may be some inconvenience to user groups as their rooms are worked on. We also ask that our (the property management committee) request, that things not be blue-tacked or taped to walls be strictly observed both during and after the re-decoration process.
